The Opportunity

School-Based Therapist Position must perform all essential job functions and duties as required by your school site. These job duties may include, but are not limited to, providing school based counseling to students, documenting counseling services, collaborating with school staff and parents, attending school based therapist team meetings, teaching social and emotional learning lessons to classrooms, providing parent consultation/education, attending support meetings for students, conducting risk assessments and mandated reporting as necessary. The Employer or site may also add other duties within the reasonable scope of the therapist's work.

Option to also provide counseling to a wide range of clients including children, pre-teens, teens, young adolescents and adults in all different socioeconomic groups in a private pay setting.

Perform all essential job functions and duties required by One Life Counseling Center, and according to the code of ethics outlined by the California Board of Behavioral health. All Associates will be expected to carry a minimum of 10-12 clients on their caseload.

This position reports directly to the Clinical Director.

Key Responsibilities

Meetings

- Attend weekly meetings with supervisor
- Attend 1x a month All Staff meeting last Monday of each month 8:30am to 9:00am
- Provide crisis intervention, family support, parent education, safety planning, and intake assessment for families and their children.
- Prepare and facilitate parent education workshops and/or parent support groups if appropriate.
- Provide appropriate psycho-education and clinical case management services.
- Collaborate with school staff and community partners to coordinate ethically appropriate, theoretically sound, culturally informed, and holistic interventions to address client issues and enhance client strengths. (as appropriate based on assignment)
- Conduct comprehensive clinical interviews with parents and clients, and provide treatment.
- Develop and deliver psychological treatment plans for children, teens, and their families, which may include individual, family, parent, and collateral therapy and behavior management.
- Coordinate clinical care with other disciplines including speech-language pathology, occupational therapy, education, psychology, and psychiatry.
- Maintain timely and clinically appropriate documentation of all clinical services.
- Attend program meetings, didactic training, clinical supervision, other mandatory training, clinical staff and team meetings as assigned, and serve on committees as needed to ensure program and service quality.
- Awareness and practice of cultural humility.
- Adhere to all mental health legal and ethical mandates and guidelines in the execution of duties, including timely completion of charting, billing, report preparation.
- Knowledge and use of computers and an Electronic Health Record (EHR) are essential.
